


# WHERE WE WORK

The Project benefits lawyers, lawyers' groups, legal NGOs, and litigants, as well as justices, judges, quasi-judicial adjudicators, prosecutors, public attorneys, and their staff.

It benefits litigants in general, especially members of vulnerable groups, who demand the improved services of courts and quasi-judicial bodies to address their justice issues.


Hustisya Natin ultimately benefits the general public that demands the improved integrity and performance of the justice system.



## WHO WE ARE




**The Alternative Law Groups, Inc. (ALG)** is a coalition of 23 legal resource nongovernmental organizations that adhere to the principles and values of alternative or developmental law.



**Ateneo Human Rights Center (AHRC)** was established as one of the first university-based institutions engaged in the promotion and protection of human rights in the country.

**Journalism for Nation Building Foundation (JNBF)** is an independent, non-profit organization that produces public-interest works in various platforms. Founded in August 2011, it seeks to promote in-depth journalism that provides context to important issues and pushes for greater transparency and accountability of officials and institutions.



**Lawyers' League for Liberty (LIBERTAS)** is comprised of individuals mostly in the Philippines who are in the legal and allied professions, including law students, advocating for transparency and accountability in Government; political and electoral reforms; respect for human rights; access to justice, and the promotion of the rule of law.



**Philippine Alliance of Human Rights Advocates (PAHRA)** is an alliance of individuals, institutions and organizations committed to the promotion, protection and realization of human rights in the country.



**Transparency and Accountability Network (TAN)** is a growing coalition of multisectoral organizations which seeks to contribute significantly to the reduction of corruption in the Philippines.


